## INTRODUCTION

In accordance with the decision of the 134<sup>th</sup> General Assembly of The Presbyterian Church in Canada (2008) this fund has been set up for "Canadian Presbyterian established mission agencies." Accordingly, access to this Fund is restricted to the established mission agencies represented on the National Native Ministries Committee of The Presbyterian Church in Canada.

Native Ministries Healing and Reconciliation funding may be used for any of the following three purposes:

- a. **Healing projects:** that support the healing journeys of residential school survivors, and/or residential schools survivors' children and subsequent generations who need healing as a result of negative effects of the residential school system on their families
- b. **Educational projects:** that help members of The Presbyterian Church in Canada deepen their knowledge and understanding about First Nation, Metis and Inuit peoples in Canada, including their history, culture, spirituality, and current issues and concerns
- c. **Reconciliation projects:** that support the development of new, or deepening of existing, relationships between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people, which specifically include members of The Presbyterian Church in Canada
